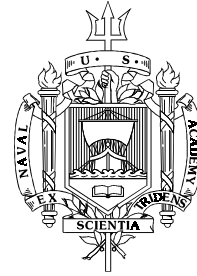

Bob spoke to us last May, and is coming back to give us an update on the Georgia State Legislature.

Bob Snelling was born in the heart of the Western Pennsylvania Steel Country in Beaver Falls. Bob was first elected to District 99 in 1994. He was reelected without opposition in '96 and '98. As a full time pilot with Delta, Bob managed to have perfect attendance at the legislature serving 160 regular session days and 20 days of the special reapportionment session in 1995.

CHAPTER NEWS

GA Tech's Paul Ohme Educates the Chapter at March Luncheon

We were fortunate to have Dr. Paul Ohme (Director of CEISMC, Center for Education in Science, Mathematics, and Computers) speak to the Chapter at the March 2002 luncheon. Dr. Ohme leads an organization dedicated to using the resources of Georgia Tech to reach and have a lasting impact on K-12th grade students through a series of educational summer programs.

According to Dr. Ohme, Georgia Tech has a vested interest in elementary, middle and high school education for three reasons: 1) Georgia Tech as a corporate citizen has a duty to support K-12th grade education. 2) 62% of Georgia Tech's incoming freshmen are from the state of Georgia. 3) The economic survival of Georgia Tech correlates with the survival of the technology industry in Atlanta and our state.

Dr. Ohme reported that only six of ten students in Georgia graduate from high school, and only 2 of those go on to college. CEISMC operates on the premise that to have an impact on Georgia's pre-undergraduate students, they need to be emersed in continuing programs for three to five years in order for the benefits to be substantial and sustainable. In

short, CEISMC strives to create a lasting impact on kids, not, in his words, "T-shirt events".

CEISMC's strategy is to partner with other bureaucracies to execute its programs. These organizations include, among others, the State Department of Education, BP/Amoco Foundation, local school districts, and teachers. Interestingly, only 4% of Georgia youth pursue careers in math, science, and engineering. Dr. Ohme's organization is working with its partners to create environments in which Georgia's youth are exposed to role models and opportunities in those fields.

Proceeds from this year's Army-Navy Golf Classic will provide scholarships for CEISMC's two-week SummerScape camp for kids.
